Intensive Arabic Course in Washington, DC
Second Session: July 8-August 1, 2005

Intermediate (Second Year) Arabic

- COURSE:** ARAB 2113 and ARAB 2223 6 college credit hours - Letter graded
- DESCRIPTION:** The purpose of this intensive course is to build on what we have covered in Beginning (First year) Arabic and to develop the five language skills (listening, speaking, reading, writing and culture) at intermediate level, including developing the ability to interact successfully in a variety of general communicative situations and to deal with short texts and topics of general import.
- Three cultural excursions are scheduled during this course. Activities include visiting mosques, attending lectures on Islam and Islam in the West, visiting Arabic restaurants and becoming acquainted with Arabic cuisine, visiting Arabic markets and book stores, meeting with members of Arabic community, and attending sessions on cultural topics, such as Arabic music and calligraphy.
- PREREQUISITE:** Beginning (first year) Arabic or the approval of instructor.
